Review - annually

Purpose

To confirm the colours that have been registered with Swimming Wellington for use by each club.

Policy

Swimming Wellington clubs need to use colours that can be differentiated from each other during competition. The colours also provide an identity for the clubs and are important part of club culture.

This policy identifies the current registered colours and the process required for a club to change their colours if they wish to.

Changing colours

- If a club wants to change its colours it must:
 - check that the colours are not already in use by another club
 - the club must request approval of its new colours from the Swimming Wellington Board
 - if the new colours are acceptable, the Swimming Wellington Board will approve the change at the next Board meeting
 - Swimming Wellington will advise the club once the new colours have been approved and can be used.
 - This policy will be updated to reflect the change.
 - If the Board does not approve the application, it will advise the club the grounds for declining the application and advice on re-submitting.

Use of colours

- Though not under the jurisdiction of this policy, Swimming Wellington encourages clubs to consider the designs they use on team gear and aim to minimise the potential for confusion between clubs, particularly those who use similar or common colours.
